How To Keep Them Healthy



They can develop respiratory problems and may wheeze and snore.

They are prone to heat stroke and obesity; Their weight should be monitored closely.

Always up for an adventure, these happy dogs love to tag along and are seldom found far from their owner's side.


How To Keep Them Healthy



Puppies of all colours can potentially occur in the same litter. Labs are the most registered breed in North America. They originated in Newfoundland, Canada and were originally called the St. John's dog.
