Bulldogs have been associated with Ventricular Septal Defect, a birth defect affecting the lower chambers of the heart. They may experience orthopedic disorders and joint problems such as hip dysplasia, patellar luxation, and shoulder luxation.

"Bulldog" has become a bit of an umbrella term - From the English Bulldog to the American Bulldog, Olde English Bulldogge, and the French Bulldog, there are plenty of Bulldogs to go around!
